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CALL FOR ABSTRACT

You are invited to submit an abstract for oral or poster presentation at "International Symposium on Perioperative Nursing", from 26 to 27 February 2019.

THEME FOR ORAL OR POSTER PRESENTATION: Perioperative Nursing

When you prepare for submitting an abstract, please keep the following guidelines in mind:

General Information

1. Note: Peer reviewers will be using a rubric to review your abstract submission. See the symposium rubric for more information.

2. Completed work or projects may be submitted for either oral or poster presentation. If the work or project is not yet complete at the time of submission, the abstract may only be submitted as a poster presentation.

3. If successfully reviewed, final abstract acceptance will be conditional upon registration by the primary presenting author. He/she should register for the symposium along with Rs 500/- scientific oral / poster presentation fee.

4. The primary presenting author should be listed first in the order of authors. All communications

will be directed to the primary presenting author only.

5. Abstracts which have been already presented or published earlier will not be accepted.

Guidelines for an abstract submission:

Abstract are to be submitted online only. (Email id: rishikeshaiims12@gmail.com)

Abstract and references should be submitted in English. 2.

- Abstract should not be more than of 300 (three hundreds) words (Excluding title and authors' 3. information).
- Abstract title, content and presentation focus should be original (not previously published or 4. presented). We recognize that a study, project or work may yield multiple findings and subsequently several original publications or presentations. To be eligible to present, submissions must contain an original title, abstract text, and subsequent presentation content (i.e., different view, perspective, or focus).

Submission Due Date: Submit all abstracts no later than 5.00 p.m. on 10 February 2019. 5.

An individual may submit more than one abstract; however, if successfully reviewed, only 6. one oral and one poster submission will be accepted for presentation in a given category.

Abstract submissions that are incomplete after the submission deadline will not be eligible 7. for presentation and will no longer be accessible by the authors.

Email confirmation of completed abstract submissions will be sent to the primary presenting 8. author only upon receipt of the complete submission with registration transection receipt of Rs. 2500/-



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9. Email notification of abstract acceptance will be sent to the primary presenting author only approximately on or before 20 February 2019.

10. Title of abstract will be of 15 (fifteen) words and must represent abstract contents.

- 11. Abstract should include study background, clear aim, methodology, major findings of study, conclusive statement and three to five key words related to study.
- 12. The title must be written in Times New Roman, bold, centrally aligned with font size-12 and text in Times New Roman with font size-11.
- 13. A maximum of six co-authors may submit a joint abstract and the primary presenting author's name should be written first. All updated information will be directed to the primary presenting author on his/ her e-mail.

14. Profile of presenting author must include: Name, Position title, Address, e-mail and Phone number.

NOTE:

- 1. All decisions on abstract acceptance or rejection by scientific committee will be final and no further communication will be entertained in this regard.
- 2. Selected scientific oral presentations will be evaluated by experts and best oral presentations will get monetary award of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand).
